I have regular 2-4 weekly gynae theatre sessions where I did both minor and major surgical procedures like abdominal hysterectomy, vaginal hysterectomy, pelvic floor repairs operation, laparoscopic procedures like salpingectomy for ectopic, salpingo-ophrectomies, cystectomy, adhesolysis, cauterization to endometriosis and sterilization and hysteroscopic procedures like, endometrial Polypectomy and endometrial ablation and evacuation of retained products of conception for miscarriage.

Volunteering Job:

Recently I worked as a volunteer for seven weeks from 24th of December 2015 to 14th of February 2016 in a missionary hospital called LAMB hospital in North West of Bangladesh. I had experienced work in busy low resource environment and was fortunate to attend and assist in two camp, one is urology camp for 3 days and fistula camp for another 3 days where many women with obstetric or surgical fistulae seen, assessed and operated upon.

Clinical skills and experience

I have obtained vast experience in obstetrics and gynaecology working in United Kingdom for many years working in different district hospitals and large university hospitals like Kings College University hospital and University Hospital of Wales. I am capable of managing labour ward as a consultant, I am confident in doing varies **obstetric** procedures like difficult caesarean sections like very preterm, placenta previa, previous multiple sections, instrumental deliveries and repair of third and fourth degree vaginal tears.

I am confident doing general **gynaecological** procedures like hysteroscopy, endometrial polypectomies, laparoscopy, evacuation of retained products of conception, abdominal and vaginal hysterectomy, and prolapsed operation.

I am also competent in <u>ultrasound scanning</u> of early pregnancy complications like bleeding and pain and it management and my previous post as a locum consultant in Wexham Park Hospital in Slough for 3 months involved running the early pregnancy assessment units with

other colleagues. I am also competent to do general gynaecological scanning for other indication like menstrual irregularities, post menopausal bleeding, pelvic pain and pelvic masses.

I have also obtained the British Society of <u>colposcopy</u> and cervical pathology BSCCP/RCOG certificate and I am able to manage women referred to colposcopy clinics with abnormal cervical smears or abnormal looking cervix.
