EXPERIENCE (Continued)

- Care for pregnant women before, during and after labor. Administer IV lines and monitor the blood flow of both the mother and the baby throughout the labor. Assist doctors in caring for women who experience childbirth complications and also assist surgeons in delivering babies through a cesarean section. Teach new mothers breastfeeding techniques. Educate new mothers about childcare and help them cope with postpartum depression.
- After an operation, checks vital signs, assists patients in recovery process and ensures a healthy recovery. This can include simple tasks such as providing food and water if needed, and more complex tasks such as quickly responding to emergencies and administering post-operative medications. The nurse also prepares the operating room/Delivery room for cleaning after surgery/delivery.

Emergency Staff Nurse

- Provide emergency medical care to an average of 50 critically ill patients per shift within a 12-bed Accident and Emergency Services Department.
- Give priority to patients who require immediate care especially those with very serious medical conditions.
- Provide quick assessments while ensuring that immediate and appropriate medical care will be given to the patient.
- Ensure the provision of quality emergency medical care to patients requiring emergency treatment in accordance with physician orders, hospital policy, and standard nursing practice.
- Provide direct patient care and assist the doctors with different procedures.
- Collaborate with members of an interdisciplinary health team.

Charge Nurse (Medical-Surgical Ward)

- Assess patient health problems and needs, develop and implement nursing care plans, and maintain medical records.
